Since 2005 she has been conceiving and directing training initiatives such as MAIA Workshops, HERMES (with Council of Europe and Eurimages) and the 2012/2013 Directors Across Borders Film Workshops, supported by the EU Culture Programme, both in the Eastern Partnership countries.

Danijel Hocevar, producer and managing director of Vertigo, a Ljubljana (Slovenia)-based production company with a distinctive track record, is a film producer with extensive working experience on international co-productions and narrow budget films. Since 1987, when he started his professional carrier as producer, Danijel has produced or co-produced more than 40 feature films, as well as more than 10 documentaries and 50 short films and TV production, among which the most well-known are An Episode in the Life of the Iron Picker by Danis Tanović (Berlinale 2013: 2 Silver Bears, Shortlisted for Foreign language Oscar); Circles by Srdan Golubović (Sundance 2013: Special Jury Award, Berlinale 2013: Ecumenical Prize); Slovenian Girl by Damjan Kozole (Toronto IFF 2009, Les Arcs FF: Best Actress Award); Sales in more than 40 territories; Spare Parts by Damjan Kozole (Berlinale Competition 2003) and Bread and Milk by Jan Cvitkovič (Venice 2001: Lion of the Future). He is also, since 2005, actively involved with several European training initiatives such as Nipkow, EAVE and Midpoint.

MARTA DONZELLI

Marta Donzelli was born in Turin in 1975. She lives and works in Rome. In 2004, with Gregorio Paonessa, she established Vivo film, an independent production company for art-house films. Vivo film's productions have been selected by some of the most prestigious international film festivals. In 2007 Il mio paese by Daniele Vicari won a David di Donatello (Italian Film Academy) as "Best Documentary" and in Locarno; Imatra by Corso Salani, was awarded a Pardo d'Oro, Special Jury Prize of "Cineasti del Presente". In 2010 Le Quattro volte by Michelangelo Frammartino, was premiered in Cannes Director's Fortnight Section and won the Europa Cinema Label Award. In 2011 Marta was Italy's "Producer on the Move" at Cannes Film Festival. Vivo Film's most recent production, Sworn Virgin by Laura Bispuri, was in Competition at the 2015 Berlinale and won the Firebird Award at the Hong Kong International Film Festival.



LINDA BEATH

Linda Beath set up Ideal Filmworks in Canada 20 years ago to raise development and production financing for international co-productions of high quality feature films and television programmes. It was incorporated in Italy in 2000 adding Business and Strategic Planning to its core business of entertainment industry financing. Linda Beath works with producers to find funding for five or six projects a year which range from features to documentaries, animated features and primetime television drama. She trains producers and other practioners in Europe and the South Mediterranean in project financing and strategic business planning for their companies. She consults to public funders on policy issues, at this time especially with respect to the industry's need for a new business model.




STEFAN RÜLL

Attorney-at-law and mediator, Stefan Rüll founded his own law firm "Rüll Law Office" in 1996 with a focus on the legal consultation and representation of film producers mainly regarding international co-productions, as well as of authors, directors, and other artists from film and television. Among the projects he counselled are feature films by Peter Greenaway, Leander Haussmann, Werner Herzog, Mike Hodges, Jeanine Meerapfel, Oscar winners Kevin McDonald and Marleen Gorris as well as Feo Aladag, Ulrich Seidl, Hans Weingartner and Wim Wenders.



NEVINA SATTA

Nevina is the CEO of Sardegna Film Commission and the Vice-President of the Italian Film Commission Association (IFC). Born in Sardinia, she got her Philosophy degree and Cultural -Media Studies and Visual Anthropology PhD in Milan, where she began her career as Filmmaker and Producer. Before returning to her homeland after twenty years, she was based in Los Angeles and Milan, developing and producing narrative features and documentaries. Professor of Film Producing and Directing in various EU Universities, she also worked as consultant of International Film Festivals and as architect of training initiatives (including Locarno Film Summer School for 18 years and African Asian Latin American Film Festival of Milan). She has founded with her husband the Unicef-endorsed NGO TravelingFilmSchool. She's specializing on Sustainability in the Creative Industries and Audiovisual Industry Funds and Institutions.





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
